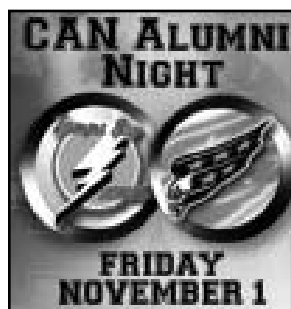
US Botanic Garden Event
