Season Arrives for CCW's "Big Red" Dragon Boat

Sign up NOW to enjoy Washington's second annual Chinese Dragon Boat Festival on **Saturday and Sunday, May 24-25**, as a member of the "Big Red Dragons". This festive event will be held on the Potomac along the Georgetown waterfront. A Dragon Boat Team consists of 20 paddlers--no previous experience necessary--plus drummer and helmsman. Beginners' lessons are about to start!

Training sessions being offered to us will start on Tuesday, April 8. Attractive dates for our three sessions are still available throughout April and May, but we have to sign up soon to get our preferred times. To do that we need to know your wishes.

Beginners' lessons and practice sessions will take place at the Anacostia Community Boathouse on Capitol Hill (Eastern Market Metro) right up until the festival. The Big Red Dragons will choose their three (3) sessions from the following offered practice times: Tuesdays, 7:00-8:00 PM and Thursdays 7:00-8:00 PM, plus Saturdays and Sundays, on both days at 12:00 noon, 1:30 PM, 3:00 PM and 4:30 PM.

Your Cornell Club's Board of Directors has agreed that we need not be too concerned about who actually attended Cornell when we recruit this boat, provided each participant makes the necessary commitment of time, energy and money to paddle under the Big Red pennant. Consider bringing a friend!

The eight gorgeous boats used in this festival were designed and constructed with traditional dragon heads and tails by Taiwanese dragon boat specialists. Scores of teams are being formed around the Greater Washington area to "power" these boats over the 500-meter course.

"Big Red Dragons" should be prepared to participate fully in the racing program itself on both Saturday and Sunday, May 24th and May 25th. Each participant should plan on a fee per person not to exceed \$45 per person. This fee will cover use of the equipment, three one-hour lessons (coaching) and two days of racing.

Cornellians familiar with their university's strong traditions in Asian Studies and the historically high enrollment of Chinese and Chinese-Americans in all of Cornell's degree-granting programs will welcome this unique opportunity to share in a cultural and sporting event with a 2,200 year history.

The ancient sport of dragon boat racing commemorates the life and death of Chu Yuan (circa 340-278 BC) a popular political leader of the State of Chu and, as China's first known poet, a towering genius in the history of Chinese literature. When he witnessed his home State of Chu falling into the hands of inept officials and weakened to the point of inviting invasion by a powerful neighbor, he committed suicide in despair by drowning himself in the Mi-Lo River.

The people of Chu, according to the tradition, raced out in their fishing boats to try and rescue him, but in vain. They were, according to both the legend and the current practices at the Festival, beating drums and gongs to scare away the evil spirits and throwing dumplings into the river to keep the fish and dragons in that aquatic realm from eating the body of their beloved poet.

It Is Time For Old Rag XXXV

On **Saturday, April 5** alumni and Cornell-in-Washington students will climb Old Rag Mountain near Sperryville, VA. This is one of the Washington Area's most popular excursions, and we expect a large turnout (25-40) each time we go.

The first 2/3 of the strenuous, 9-mile hike is on a trail through the trees, while the upper part is open and rocky. Lunch and water should be carried in a day-pack, and a hat and sturdy shoes should be worn. The total time needed for climbing, enjoying the view, eating and descending is about 6 hours. The Park Service has a \$5 fee per person and allows no more hikers after the parking lot is full. Therefore, a prompt 8 AM start from the Cornell Center is needed for this full-day event.
