

2009 CCW Annual Dinner

BETHESDA, May 26th. Over 90 Cornell alumni gathered at Tragara Ristorante to attend the club's Annual Dinner. The evening began with the President's report, where Kim Jones '98, MBA '02 highlighted significant accomplishments from the past year.

Key programs included a packed Zinck's Night, tree planting at a Habitat for Humanity site, the new Knitting Group, Ice Skating at Cabin John, a Pre-Reunion event at the Kiplinger Gallery, Big Red Basketball and Hockey Game Watches, an Evening at the Finnish Embassy with the Ambassador, a Symposium with the Cornell Center for a Sustainable Future, and an evening with the NY and DC Public Schools Chancellors.

Additionally, the club continued its collaboration with other alumni groups, began accepting membership dues payment online, and launched a partnership with the DC Department of Parks & Recreation.

We thanked this year's officers, as well as the dedicated group of past presidents, for their service, and toasted Linda Johnson for her 25 years of commitment to the Cornell in Washington program. We also honored the staff of the Middle Atlantic Regional Office—Carolyn Casswell, Janet Heinis, Mary Ann Nelson and Patricia Fosbenner—for their incredible support as that office prepares to close on June 31st.

Immediate Past President Jonathan Simon '92 presented the slate of the 2009-2010 officers; an amazing group ready to continue the CCW legacy. Award presentations followed, with the Best Program Award going to Glenn Strahs '74 and Nicole DelToro '91 for the outstanding Cabin John Ice Skating event. Dan Lavanga '89 received the distinguished Bondareff Award in recognition of his years of service leading the tutoring program and dedication to the Club.

The evening ended on a strong note, with guest speaker Knight Kiplinger '69 talking about the current economic environment. As Editor-in-Chief of Kiplinger Personal Finance, Kiplinger.com and the Kiplinger Letter, Knight has covered business, economic and political trends for nearly three decades, as a newspaper reporter, Washington bureau chief and editor. Thanks go to everyone who made the 2008-2009 year a big success!

Public School Chancellors Rhee and Klein Talk Reform

On March 6th, the Columbia and Cornell DC alumni clubs hosted an evening with New York City Public Schools Chancellor Joel Klein, Columbia '67 and his DC counterpart, Michelle Rhee, Cornell '92. They talked with moderator David Johns, education policy advisor to Sen. Edward Kennedy, about the two most closely watched public school overhauls in the country.

The New York school system (1,500 schools, 1.1 million students, 136,000 employees, \$22 billion annual budget) is significantly larger than the District's (120 schools, 45,000 students, 3,500 teachers, \$800 million budget). Klein recommended Rhee—who formerly consulted with him through her teacher headhunting non-profit—to Mayor Fenty for the Chancellor position in 2007 and they have stayed in close touch.

The Chancellors made it clear they are on the same page when it comes to the fundamentals of school transformation. They are both working to revamp bureaucratic cultures historically focused on the needs of adults rather than children. They want high-achieving schools, whether they are charter or traditional public. Both are in search of concessions from powerful unions that would allow them to leverage more control over hiring teachers and retaining the best of them. "I'd rather have a great teacher in a school system for two years than a mediocre teacher for 20 years," said Rhee.

Both cities have made the significant change of mayoral control of schools. Klein has run the New York system for seven years and cited a steady growth in high school graduation rates and statewide standardized tests. He said he came primarily to call for broader support of Rhee, indicating that on a scale of one to ten, "I give Michelle a 10."

Washington Alumni Hear About Cornell's 'Culture of Sustainability'

From the May 13th Cornell Chronicle Online article about the April 28th Sustainability Symposium, which was supported by a grant from the Cornell Alumni Federation.

Cornell is cultivating a "culture of sustainability" with faculty expertise in climate change, food safety, energy, environment, poverty and the green economy. So said Mike Hoffmann, professor of entomology and director of the Cornell University Agricultural Experiment Station, and other faculty members affiliated with the Cornell Center for a Sustainable Future (CCSF), addressing about 100 Cornell alumni and researchers at the National Academy of Sciences in Washington, D.C., April 28.

All these issues can be described as "system problems for which sustainability is the appropriate response," said Frank DiSalvo, the J.A. Newman Professor of Physical Science and director of the CCSF. Cornell leads the way, he said, with President David Skorton's commitment to carbon neutrality, the LEED Gold design of Weill Hall as well as the recent selection of Cornell by the U.S. Department of Energy as a site for one of the Energy Frontier Research Centers. He also pointed to Cornell's hydropower plant, Lake Source Cooling and Combined Heat and Power Plant projects as "living laboratories for Cornell research.

Also on the panel were Jeff Tester, the Croll Professor of Sustainable Energy Systems and CCSF associate director for energy programs, who said he recently relocated from MIT because of Cornell's "commitment of the entire institution to sustainability"; and Anurag Agrawal, associate professor of ecology and evolutionary biology and CCSF associate director for environment programs, who noted that his "dreams are coming true with Cornell fostering growth in my own areas of expertise and helping bridge to partnerships in vast areas of sustainability."

Post tour, those who are interested will proceed with picnics to an area near the Vietnam War Veterans Memorial Wall to hear a brief discussion and question/answer session about Maya Lin's Vietnam War Veterans Memorial. We will touch upon the review process Ms. Lin experienced, and that artist/architects may encounter in their professions, while eating our picnic supper. We will then walk through the Monument as the as the light fades. Dessert will be provided.

Note: We need a few volunteer carpoolers to transport an ice cooler (no alcohol please), some folding seats, and those who do not wish or are unable to walk from the Corcoran to the Wall. Carpoolers may return those that require rides back to their cars or Metro at the close of the evening. If you are able to provide a ride, let us know as soon as possible so that we can coordinate our efforts in advance.
